The Pritzker Military Museum & Library and Evanston History Center Host Colonel Bree Fram



KENOSHA – May 7, 2025 - The Pritzker Military Museum & Library (PMML) in partnership with the Evanston History Center will host Colonel Bree Fram for the program, *Transgender Service in Turbulent Times: A Pritzker Military Museum & Library Talk at the Evanston History Center*, on May 20, 2025.

COL Fram, an aeronautical engineer, author, podcaster, and active-duty Colonel in the United States Space Force, shares her story and the sweep of American history, to discuss why an inclusive military is critical to national security today and far into the future. She also provides insight into the contemporary issues faced by transgender troops in the current administration.

COL Fram is also one of the editors of the book, *With Valor and Visibility*, which features a collection of forty-seven accounts from transgender servicepeople and veterans offering their experiences being transgender in the military.

The evening program will include a light reception, lecture, Q&A, and book signing. Col. Fram's books will be available for purchase at the event. The program will take place at the Evanston History Center, 225 Greenwood Street, Evanston. The reception begins at 5:30 p.m. and the lecture promptly at 6:00 p.m.
